Where do I recycle this ...?

There are many items that we come across in our routines that we aren't real sure how to dispose of. The convenience sites will take regular recycling such as paper, plastic, aluminum, tin and glass. They will also accept appliances and scrap metal, rechargeable batteries, cell phones and oyster shells. We can dispose of latex paint and cans, used motor oil and filters, anti-freeze and electronics at the County Landfill.
