



Anopheles barberi Biology

Anopheles barberi is the only tree hole *Anopheles* mosquito in Brunswick County. They are extremely rare. The larvae are found in rot cavities (tree holes) in trees of many kinds. The few collections of *Anopheles barberi* in the County have been larval collections. This mosquito has not been collected in Brunswick County since the early 1990's. She is not considered an important mosquito in the County.
