



Anopheles walkeri Biology

Brunswick County Mosquito Control**

The larvae of *Anopheles walkeri* occur in fresh-water marshes containing emergent or floating vegetation or debris. This mosquito is extremely rare in Brunswick County. The few collections of *Anopheles walkeri* in the County have been adult collections. The adults are readily attracted to light traps. This mosquito has not been collected in county since the early 1990's. She is not considered an important mosquito in the County.
