

SEPTAGE RECEIVING OPERATING PLAN

FACILITY NAME AND LOCATION

WEST BRUNSWICK WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY

235 GREY WATER ROAD, SUPPLY

TYPE OF WASTE ACCEPTED

The County will accept waste only from residential septic tanks and similar systems. No industrial waste will be accepted at this facility. Grease from grease traps will also not be accepted at this facility. The treatment plant staff shall have the right to refuse acceptance of any waste that they deem to be harmful to the treatment plant processes.

HOURS OF OPERATION

The West Brunswick Water Reclamation Facility will accept septage waste:

Monday – Friday: 8 a.m. - 6 p.m.

Weekends and Holidays: 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Waste will not be accepted at any other times.

HAULER PERMITTING

All septage haulers transporting waste to the West Brunswick Water Reclamation Facility must have a valid license issued by the NC DENR. The County will also require each septage hauler to enter into a contract with the County and pay a licensing fee per truck for use of the facility. All haulers and their employees must attend required training for use of the septage facility before use of the facility. **All waste hauled to the facility must be generated within Brunswick County.** Any hauler found to be in violation of this requirement will have their right to bring waste to the facility revoked with no refund of fees previously paid.

DELIVERY AT THE FACILITY

The County will only receive material from septage vehicles that have been properly licensed and authorized to use the facility. Loads will be discharged from the vehicles at the designated discharge point. The septage hauler shall be responsible for proper connection and must be present during discharge operations. The hauler shall be responsible for clean up of any septage spilled.

The septage hauler must sign the septage hauler log book. The hauler must clearly show the name of the company, truck number, name of the driver, origin of the waste, and sign the book. The septage hauler must provide plant personnel with the appropriate number of prepaid load tickets before being allowed to discharge.

The County reserves the right to take samples from any truck and to deny the right to discharge to a hauler with waste that may be detrimental to the treatment process such as industrial waste or petroleum waste.

FEES

Annual licensing fees are due by January 15 of each year.

The Septage Disposal Firm must purchase load tickets in advance at the Public Utilities Department Customer Service Offices located in Building I at the County Complex in Bolivia. Load tickets will be available in books of ten and will cost \$800. The Septage Disposal firm driver will present one ticket to the plant staff for loads 2,000 gallons or less and two tickets for loads that exceed 2,000 gallons. No truck will be allowed to discharge waste at the plant without presenting a ticket to the plant staff and signing the log book.
