REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR

Addendum I

The below questions were asked from interested contractors. Responses are in red. Questions and responses are included as Addendum I.

1. Will trees near the stream corridor that have fallen away from the creek be required to be removed?

No floodplain clearing will occur. Work will only take place within the stream corridor.

“The work to be performed is specific for each site and may include stream debris removal from the stream corridor, streambank stabilization, hauling and disposal of debris, and backfilling and sediment removal. Brunswick County will require all debris removed from the channel to be placed a minimum of twenty (20) feet from the edge of the bank to prevent the debris from floating back into the stream and when possible, to be placed on the same side of the stream from which the debris originated.”

2. Upon assessment of the various sites there was little to no observation of marked/flagged limits. Will a representative be on site to advise on direction and start/finish limitations of the debris removal or will the areas be surveyed and flagged before work begins?

Yes, the limits will be flagged before the contract is fully executed.

“The limits (upstream and downstream) of stream debris removal from the stream corridor will be flagged by the USDA NRCS representative or Brunswick County staff. Estimated stream debris removal limits are subject to change.”

“Brunswick County and USDA NRCS staff will conduct regular site visits to ensure the quality of work performed. Brunswick County and USDA NRCS will not RFP – Emergency Watershed Protection Project Round 2 PAGE 4 release payment to the contractor until the completed work has been approved by Brunswick County and USDA NRCS staff.”

3. Does your RFP require that any bidder must have a Nc Contractors license?

The RFP does not require a North Carolina Contractors License. Applicants must meet the criteria within the RFP to bid.

4. Can you please confirm that landfill tipping fees will be treated as a pass through expense?

Tipping fees will be the responsibility of the contractor. These costs should be included in the proposal.
